- Work with the LEA in addressing problems, if any, on parental involvement activities implementation in section 1118 of Title I, Part A.
- Work with the LEA to ensure that a copy of the SEA's written complaint
 procedures for resolving any issue of violation(s) of a Federal statute or
 regulation of Title I, Part A programs is provided to parents/legal guardians of
 students and to appropriate private school officials or representatives.
