1. 2. *Jess Harben Elementary* receives Title I, Part A funds. 7. *Jess Harben Elementary* will use the findings of such evaluation to design evidence-based strategies for more effective parental involvement, and to revise, if necessary, the parent and family engagement policies; and Section 1116 (a)(2)(E)

Parents will give us input through surveys and our Site Based Decision Making Team. We will adjust our plans based on the input from all stakeholders.

Jess Harben has a Site Based Decision Making Team with 6 elected people that represent our families.

We also have a strong PTA that provides support for our activities and community engagement
