Jr. Beta Club	Junior Beta Club is a national service organization that recognizes students who have demonstrated outstanding academic achievement, exemplified worthy character, and maintained a commendable attitude. Students are invited to join the NHE chapter, which promotes character and social responsibility, encourages service involvement for school and community, fosters leadership skills, and provides settings for members to develop interpersonal relationship skills.	Prospective 5th grade members are nominated by 5th grade teachers at the end of the first semester. A nominee's grade point average in each subject must be 80% or higher, and s/he must have an S or an E in all citizenship grades to join Beta Club and to remain a member in good standing. 5th graders are inducted into Beta Club in a ceremony in late January. During busy fundraising drives, (e.g. December), meetings (or selling Candygrams after school) may be more frequent. Students also help with school events like Meet The Teacher, Kindergarten Roundup, Open House, etc. Information about these additional events is sent home in a permission slip.

Students must arrive each day by 7:35 to participate. Students are expected to be role models, so poor behavioral choices may lead to suspension or disqualification to participate.	Each March, 5th grade students are given the opportunity to complete a KFLY application that includes why they want to be on the team, the roles they would like to perform, as well as parental permission that acknowledges that students must arrive by 7:35AM to participate. Each spring, our 6th grade KFLY team trains the new 5th graders to take over, so that we have an experienced team at the start of the next school year.
